Throughout the day, the children “travelled” to different continents and took part in fun, practical maths challenges linked to:

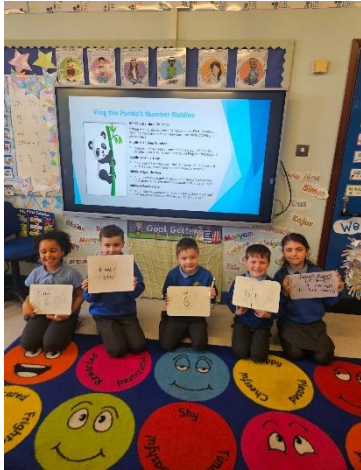
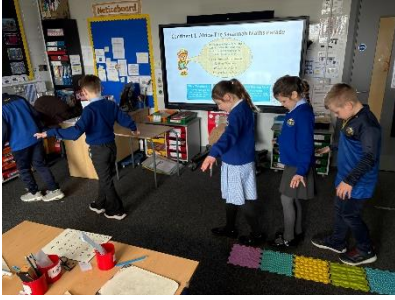
- counting

All activities were designed to be active, enjoyable, and accessible for every child, helping them see how maths is used in the world around them.

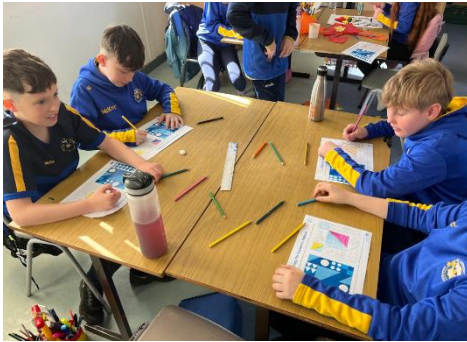


Key Stage 2 Pupils

This year, Key Stage 2 focused on two key themes:

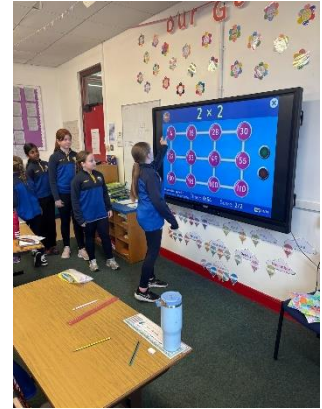
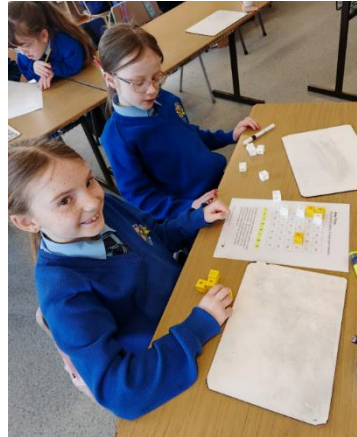
1. Maths Art

2. Number Fluency

Activities highlighted the importance of number confidence and accuracy, promoting mental strategies, quick recall, and flexible thinking with numbers.
