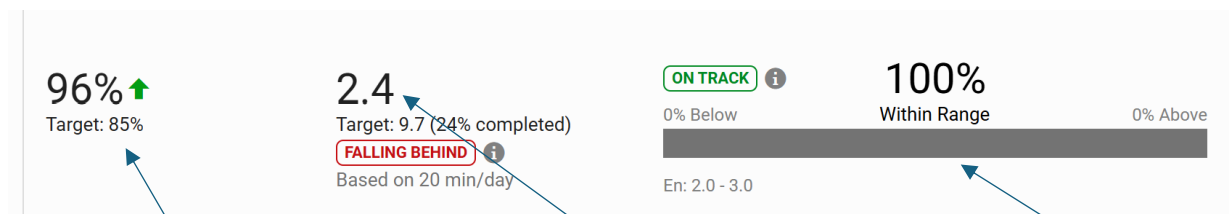
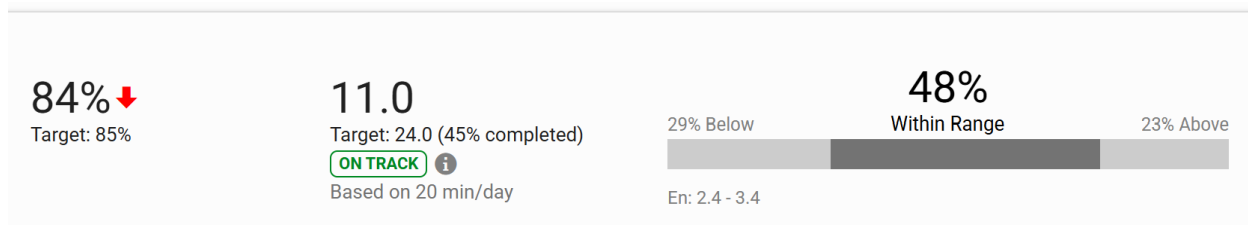


Dear Parent/Guardian,

Primary 4 is the first year the children take part in the Accelerated Reader (AR) programme. At this stage, we aim to help pupils develop a real enjoyment of reading while also building their confidence and independence as readers. The programme supports them in choosing appropriate books, spending regular time reading, and completing short quizzes to check their understanding

This week, you will find a short update slip, like one of the two examples shown below, in your child's homework book regarding their progress in Accelerated Reader.



This is your child's average quiz score from all quizzes taken since the beginning of Term 2 (January 2026). The target score that demonstrates good understanding is 85%.

This is the number of points your child has earned this term. Their target points for Term 2 is also shown. The figure in brackets shows their progress towards meeting this target.

Reading range shows how much reading children are doing below, within, and above their target range. This can help determine if their reading is easy, challenging or just right.

- Check if your child is regularly getting new AR books. If their update shows little progress, it might mean they aren't bringing home or accessing new books to read for Accelerated Reader (AR).
- Think about how much time they're spending reading their AR books. Regular reading will help them move through the AR programme successfully.
- Encourage them to complete AR quizzes once they finish a book. These quizzes are an important part of the programme. They should use the AR link on the school website to access the quiz page.

We hope this supports you in understanding more about your child's participation in Accelerated Reader.
